corporation after speaking to some representatives from Salluit when we were discussing the Mary River project back then. I spoke to a representative from Salluit and they told us they certainly can help us (in creating a corporation). That is their position and it would be very beneficial. This is different from what Charlie Innuarak has been saying about wanting to create a corporation. The one I am talking about seems easy to achieve about the corporation which we want to incorporate. It would only be for the community of Pond Inlet. I want to make this clear. We have never mentioned what Charlie Innuarak wants to establish and has not been discussed by the people of Pond Inlet. The QIA community representative should discuss it with QIA, he cannot do it alone. He is not an advisor. That being the case, we will continue to plan for the creation of a corporation. If you can have the Nunavik representatives come to Pond Inlet, that would be very beneficial. If you cannot invite them to Pond Inlet, we can, in some way have them come to Pond Inlet. So we can properly understand that the people of Pond Inlet can be assisted. The High Arctic communities that Charlie Innuarak has been referring to, I had some topic of discussion with them as well. I tell them you too can create your own corporation: each individual community can establish a corporation. It would be simpler for the communities in establishing a corporation. You would continue to support them. And we can also start a petition about this issue. We've not had a meeting lately but has met in the past. We have signed some documents but it has not really progressed forward but we want it to go ahead. Pond Inlet is the most impacted community than other communities and we need to be compensated. If we did indeed create a corporation, royalty payments can then be distributed to us just like they do in Salluit. I wanted to assure you that there are differences (to what Charlie Innuarak wants to create) and what we want to create and therefore I wanted to be a delegate. We can create a corporation for the High Arctic. What Charlie Innuarak is trying to achieve is very difficult and I have been told that it would likely take 30 years to achieve. But the corporation created for Pond Inlet

13. Deputy Mayor's Report:
Moses Koonark: We went to a meeting at the Community Hall. Tower Arctic had an open house at the Community Hall regarding how they will proceed with construction in the fall. They said have completed the construction season for the year. Dredging of the bottom has been completed but some areas are not completed. They are confident that they will complete the project next year. They speculate that they will complete the project in 2021. They said they will arrive next year in the middle of April to prepare for the summer construction. When they arrive in mid April, they will start quarrying during the middle of May. They will start hauling large boulders in mid May. The docking area for ships has not been drilled yet but will be completed next year. These were reported on during our meeting. The mooring area for boats has been completed 75%. The area in front of the RCMP area barrier which is slightly horizontal and has large boulders on the ocean side, they said it has been completed. Tower Arctic had a question period allotted and people felt that the barrier with large boulder was too close to shore. They felt it could have been further away. And they felt in some marine areas of the dock, it was too shallow. There should be some dredging. The area in front of the RCMP is very rocky and they were asked if they would remove the rocks. I felt the mooring area for boats is too close to the shore. They did not really

Moses Koonark: Perhaps when the Mayor returns, we can discuss it further. I forgot to mention what I was supposed to say we are under heavy stress because radio announcers are going through hard times. It is getting harder to retain radio announcers who will keep the radio on air. They have given up when they try to keep it open because they are bothered by intoxicated people. Some of the announcers have refused to come to the radio station because of alcohol when abuse is directed at the announcers and is causing stress. We want to refer this issue to the Hamlet so something can be done about the radio announcers and the people. This is very heavy to bear for us and Pond Inlet as a whole. The radio station is open in the morning but the announcer has made it clear that intoxicated persons are too heavy to bear. That is where we're at. Alcohol is not the only problem, they also use other intoxicants, which why it is. We want to refer this matter to the CAO so he can try to find a solution.
